Impact of PSP Service on PSP Family Members

- Confronting workplace injury or illness
- Anxieties that accompany PSP work
- Boundary confusion: bringing work home
- Public perceptions
- Irregular work schedules and sleep disruptions
- Resentment
- Lack of employer and community supports

## Support Service Needs of PSP Members

Public Safety Personne

- Resiliency Training (upstream): PSP require culturally specific resiliency training that combines relevant and useable knowledge, skills practice, and ongoing social support to support their operational careers. This training works to remove stigma, which so often serves as a barrier to care.
- **Treatment:** PSP require culturally specific counselling services, organization and community support to address the realities of trauma exposure, moral injuries, sanctuary trauma and diagnosis such as PTSD, anxiety and depression.



## Support Service Needs of PSP Families

- Regulation and resourcing skills to help PSP families understand their function of emotions while exploring parts of themselves that can become injured in their relationship with an injured spouse or parent.
- Programming that supports the acquisition of relationship skills while enabling PSP families to build satisfying social support networks and identifying and claiming their own future-focused needs that promote renewal and hope.
